

A MESSAGE FROM FR WELDIT

Established in honor of the birth of the infant Jesus Christ in Bethlehem, Christmas has a long history with unique traditions and customs throughout the world which include decorating Christmas trees, cooking festive meals, Christmas caroling, going to the church and visiting relatives, just to name a few.

As parochial vicar residing at St Brendan (Western Rite) who is in holy service to the Eritrean Catholic Community (Eastern Rite), I would like to point out some of the similarities and differences between Christmas celebrations in Eastern and Western Christianity that may be of interest.

Did you know that Catholic and Orthodox Christians celebrate Christmas on different days? The reason for this is because Western and Eastern churches have different systems of chronology. After the new Gregorian calendar was drawn up in the West, Catholics and Protestants began celebrating Christmas two weeks earlier than Orthodox Christians.

Christians of the Western rite celebrate Christmas by the Gregorian calendar – from December 24 to December 25, while Eastern Christians celebrate Christmas according to the Julian calendar – from January 6 to January 7.

The Christmas season ended on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. *Or did it?* Every January, discussions amongst Christians crop up as to when the Christmas season officially ends. For Christians who follow the Western tradition, the season concluded at that time. However, for us Eritreans, the Christmas season had just begun.

Christians in the Eastern Church follow the Julian calendar and celebrate Christmas on the traditional date of January 7. Epiphany is celebrated on January 19. The name *Epiphany* comes from the Greek *epiphaneia*, meaning "appearance" or "manifestation," and refers to the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the world – for those following these original dates, the season is in full swing. Prayers, music, food, and fun are still going strong as we enter the middle of January.

Although God is invisible by nature and supernatural, when the fullness of time came, He became a man like us in short stature and narrow limits. The Apostle John wrote, "No man hath seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him," John 1:1. At the time of the baptism of our Lord, the mystery of the unity and trinity of the Holy Trinity was revealed. When the Son was being baptized in the flesh, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Lord in the form of a dove, and from heaven, God the Father, uttered a voice. This was the stage where the mystery of the Trinity was first revealed, and therefore, we say, it became a "revelation."

If we understand that revelation means the revelation of God, we cannot lose sight of its importance in our lives. We can have fellowship with God because He "revealed" it to us through the Lord Jesus. "Behold, the virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and they shall call his name *Immanuel*" (which means "God with us") and John wrote, "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth," John 1:1.

"Our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary," is our apostolic creed which we all confess. The world celebrates the birth and revelation of the Lord Jesus Christ on two different days. Two calendars, one mystery of the incarnation. One lesson, one meaning, one message, in the one Savior, Jesus Christ our redeemer.



THE EUCHARIST AND THE SAINTS: ST TERESA OF CALCUTTA

Eucharistic Adoration was one of Mother Teresa's primary spiritual habits. Spending time with Jesus in the Eucharist was an essential part of what made her who she was. It is a habit she shared with almost every saint who has ever lived. The world was obsessed with the power and magnetism of her goodness, and yet, the world ignored the source of the holiness she manifested everywhere she went.

It would have been easy for her to lose herself in the enormous fame the world lavished on her. Why didn't she? The media is full of stories about famous people who have been chewed up and spat out by fame. Why didn't fame affect Mother Teresa in the same way?

She spent the first hour of each day before the Blessed Sacrament in Adoration. As the impact of her work grew, some of those close to her asked her to reduce this to thirty minutes, pointing out that every minute she spend with people bore tremendous fruit. This may have seemed reasonable and rational to those proposing the change, especially in light of all of Mother Teresa's other daily spiritual practices. So, did she capitulate? No. She increased her time of Adoration to TWO hours each morning and reminded those closest to her that Jesus was the source of all the fruit their work was bearing. Later, as her legend grew, she increased her daily Adoration to THREE hours.







Jon 3:1-5, 10 | 1 Cor 7:29-31 | Mk 1:14-20

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Sometimes I feel like I need a Jonah in my life: someone who will come along and shake things up; someone who will nudge me and say, hey, you're doing it wrong! No one wants to be criticized, but I know I need loving guidance to help me when I am not at my best. It's easy to get caught up in the swirl of life and neglect (even if unintentionally) what's important. Jonah was given the unpleasant task of pointing out to the people of Nineveh their failings. Unlike many communities who resisted God's words, by the end of the first day of Jonah's anticipated three-day trek across the city, "the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth." For all the evil they had done, and the rebellion they had demonstrated, the people there weren't irredeemable. They simply needed Jonah to point out how they had gone astray, and the grace of open ears and hearts to receive the message. Who has the Lord placed in our lives in the role of Jonah? How has he blessed us with the ability to receive, and repent where necessary?

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

We don't seem to have obvious prophets like Jonah nowadays, but that doesn't mean God has left us without guides. We have the Church, Christ's body on earth, and the ever-present help of the Holy Spirit. In today's Gospel, we hear how Jesus selected his first followers: men who would become the Twelve Apostles, anointed to spread his word and speak in his stead even after Jesus left the earth. We know that there were other followers: men, women and children who became his disciples; Jews and Gentiles who were baptized. We are part of that apostolic tradition, each one of us baptized into the common priesthood "exercised by the unfolding of baptismal grace - a life of faith, hope, and charity, a life according to the Spirit." (CCC 1547) The call to holiness can be hard to hear in the din of today's busy and secular world, but it is not impossible. We can pray for the grace to hear how God is ask-ing each of us to live out his commands and proclaim the Good News to the world.
