

### A MESSAGE FROM FR WELDIT



In today's humanistic culture, society is losing sight of life's grand purpose, the mission established by God and given to us by His Son, Jesus Christ. Far too many are living in the "now," trapped by the worldly pitfalls that surround them. In their pursuit of wealth, business success, entertainment, and immodest relationships, they've strayed further from authentic fulfillment. While some may consistently succeed in attaining their earthly goals, many testify experiencing a lingering emptiness. Our culture needs to assess whether their personal motivations

have placed them on a path to true purpose and satisfaction.

The real meaning of life, both now and in eternity, is found in the restoration of our relationship with God. This restoration is only possible through God's Son, Jesus Christ, who reconciles us to God (Romans 5:10). Jesus gives Himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because He loves us. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through His humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). Salvation and eternal life are gifts from God when we trust in Jesus Christ as Savior. Christ makes us new creations, and we begin the journey of growing closer to Him and learning to rely on Him through His Body and Blood. God wants us to know the meaning of life. Jesus said, "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full" (John 10:10). A "full" life is one that is meaningful and devoid of aimless wandering.

Just as love gives birth to life, the Eucharist gives birth to life-giving love. We may remember what Jesus said when He spoke about life. "I have come that they may have life and have it to the full." (John 10:10). He is not talking about the short physical life in this world, but about the divine and eternal life in union with Him. He tells us that He is the true life and the Way, saying, "I am the way and the life" (John 14:16). Jesus Christ says that the food this life needs is the Eucharist. "Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. I am the bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in your souls." Just as there is a parallel between food and being fed, so there is a parallel between the Eucharist that feeds us. Just as food combines with our body to give us temporary life, so when we are nourished by the Holy Communion, we find peace, rest, and joy and we get eternal life. Living a Eucharistic Life is about being transformed by the presence of Christ to become His very life for the world.

Likewise, in the Second Vatican Council on the Church Proclamation, Lumen Gentium: the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, No. 26 speaks of our participation in the Eucharist,"when we partake of the Eucharist table, we are the recipients who are transformed into it."

The Eucharist is the gift of our life received through the life of Christ on the cross. Through our full participation in the Eucharist in our daily lives, we become blessed and for the blessing of others, the life of Jesus is revealed in us; we become thankful, our days are blessed, and the grace of God flows around us.



## HOW TO RECEIVE COMMUNION TO THE FULLEST

### **Spiritual Meaning:**

"Active participation" in the Mass finds its pinnacle in the worthy reception of the Eucharist. It is the best way to participate in Jesus' saving work. Receiving the Eucharist to its fullest requires a desire to be transformed by what we eat and drink – Jesus – so that He can live in us. Humility and docility are needed.

### Participation:

Hear Jesus' words to St Augustine: "You shall not change me, like the food of your flesh, into yourself, but you shall be changed into me." Imitate the faithful, humble centurion when we say, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." Pray St Ignatius' prayer of surrender and union with God upon returning to the pew:

Receive, Lord, my entire freedom.
Accept the whole of my memory,
my intellect and my will. Whatever
I have or possess, it was You who
gave it to me; I restore it to You in
full, and I surrender it completely to
the guidance of Your will. Give me
only love of You together with Your
grace, and I am rich enough and ask
for nothing more. Amen

### ST VINCENT DE PAUL 2023 PARISH REPORT

Vincentian Spirituality is the seeking to bear witness to the love of Christ through prayer, meditation on the Scriptures, the teaching of the Church, through our daily lives, and in our relationship with those in need.

There are currently 41 full members and 24 associate members of St Brendan's St Vincent de Paul Society. From Oct 1, 2022-Sept 30, 2023, members responded to 179 calls for assistance. Parishioners' monetary and "in kind" donations enabled St Vincent de Paul Society to continue works of mercy and helped alleviate suffering for the needy in our community and in the neediest parts of the diocese.

### INCENSE AT MASS – WHY & WHEN IT'S USED

The purpose of incensing and the symbolic value of the smoke is that of purification and sanctification. The smoke symbolizes the prayers of the faithful drifting up to heaven: the Psalmist prays, "Let my prayer come like incense before you; the lifting up of my hands, like the evening sacrifice" (Psalm 141). Incense creates the ambiance of heaven. The Book of Revelation describes it as: "Another angel came in holding a censer of gold. He took his place at the altar of incense and was given large amounts of incense to deposit on the altar of gold in front of the throne, together with the prayers of all God's holy ones." The usage of incense also adds a sense of solemnity and mystery to the Mass. The visual imagery of the smoke and the smell remind us of the transcendence of the Mass which links heaven with earth, and allow us to enter into the presence of God.

We are aware that incense at Mass may become uncomfortable for some parishioners due to allergies and smoke sensitivities. Therefore, we will be limiting its use to one Mass per weekend and will advertise that schedule ahead of time. Look for the thurible icon (see below) with Mass time listed on our bulletin weekly parish calendars.



### The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Ez 34:11-12, 15-17 | 1 Cor 15:20-26, 28 | Mt 25:31-46

### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

The paradoxical ways we have come to understand Jesus can give us spiritual whiplash. He is both a tender and caring shepherd of sheep and one who sends strong rams and goats to the eternal fire; the executed human and divine man who came into full resurrected glory. He is God incarnate into human history and born in a manger; the servant-leader; the one who is both God and man. This is the beauty of what we call the Paschal Mystery - that the Son of God came into the world and by his life, death, and resurrection he has reconciled us to the Father, and has re-deemed us. He saves us from the death of sin. As Catholics we are comfortable with paradox: We are inhabitants of a kingdom of God that is already (here) but not yet (fully realized); we are both an Easter people and we live in a world of Good Fridays. So when Jesus says in today's Gospel that whatever we do to the least of people, we do to Christ himself and we will reap our actions in the fullness of that kingdom, we understand that he is a king unlike any other king. He cares not for pomp and circumstance, but wants to ensure that all - even the least among us - are given his gifts to share. The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe cele-brates that we have a king who cares more for us than anyone on earth could ever care for us, and we are blessed to be able to love and serve him in return.

### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In the midst of our busy lives, it is no secret that our thoughts can easily be preoccupied with things other than prayer or our relationship with God. Perhaps we struggle with maintaining a daily prayer practice. So when we pause to take stock of our lives – where our attention is focused during the day-to-day – it's easy to see that God is sometimes "off to the side." Perhaps we take everything we have been given for granted, or maybe we are just not sure how to make him the most important aspect of our lives. Just like cultivating a friendship takes active effort, so does our relationship with God. Just as watering a plant near its center allows the water to spread throughout the surrounding area, to its roots and the soil – thus making it fruitful and full – putting Jesus Christ, our king, at the center of our lives means that his goodness flows into everything else we say and do. Our lives and our hearts will grow in goodness and bear rich fruit.

**INVITATION** Challenge yourself this week to subvert expectations and keep God first. Show Christ is Lord over your life by prioritizing your faith and building up your priorities around him. Make a daily appointment in your calendar for prayer and look for opportunities to put Christ at the center, or heart, of your daily life.




