PRAYING THEM HOME

WHAT TO DO TO BRING LOVED ONES HOME... AND WHAT NOT TO DO!

Raised Protestant, and married to a cradle Catholic, I didn't hesitate to raise our children in the Catholic faith. (After all, the church of my childhood never claimed to be the Church that Jesus had established!) I had attended Mass with my husband for 16 years before becoming Catholic through RCIA. When I was finally able to take Communion, it was a very emotional experience and I would often hold back tears of gratitude heading up to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. Through my desire to share my new joy with everyone I knew (especially those who had left the Catholic faith), let's just say... I went a bit overboard! My tone/actions had created roadblocks for further discussions, which was the opposite result I was trying to achieve. Here is what Steve Ray has to say on *Catholic Answers* about what NOT to do and what TO do:

Don't Argue – Our first inclination when confronted by a fallen-away Catholic is to argue, often displaying our anger and pain. If it is a family member or friend, we are inclined to think it is our job to quickly retrieve them from their error. With good intentions, we press the issue by confronting them and using emotionally charged comments. The result is often the opposite of the intention. The loved one is usually pushed further away and more deeply entrenched in his resolve to resist. Bridges are burned, and discussion shuts down. After a few heated confrontations or silent treatments, the doors to conversation close. It is usually too late when we realize we've only made matters worse. But regret and remorse don't fix anything unless we act on them. Love for souls—and relationships—often requires us to confess our faults and to humbly ask for forgiveness for things said in the heat of the moment. Good intentions, yes, but not always good results!

Love them more than ever – Our love for them is the cause of our hurt and the desire to win them over, but we need our love directed carefully with the big picture in mind. At the point when they expect us to react negatively, respond with love. Love is the one argument no one can resist.

Pray and make sacrifices – We often spend our time creating imaginary arguments in our heads when we should direct our energy and time to prayer. Make a prayer list, and pray persistently.

Study the Catholic Faith – We are not Catholic Christians because it makes us feel good or because it was the way we were raised. We are Catholics because the Faith is true. And if it is true, we should know why it is true and be able to explain it to ourselves and to others.

Show the Lord's joy in your life – Joy, happiness, and love attract people. Anger, frustration, and discontent alienate them. Our joy and gladness in the Lord should be contagious; they should draw people to Jesus and His Church. We should make our acquaintances inquire, "Why is he so joyful? What does he have that I don't have?" If we grumble and gossip, it will convince the lost ones that they have indeed received the better part.

Ask God to bring someone else to influence them – With family or friends, we think it is our job to win back the lost. But ultimately, it is not our job; it is the job of the Holy Spirit, and He may likely choose to use someone else rather than us. He will use your prayers and maybe someone else's immediate influence. So pray that way!

As a cradle Catholic and a revert, I can tell you, there wasn't much anyone could say or do to make me see what I was missing while away from our faith. Even though I grew up Catholic, was educated as a Catholic and knew what I was supposed to do, I just didn't want to do it. But why? Why do so many Catholics abandon their faith? Stubbornness, Iaziness, ways of the world, influences from non-Catholics or friends, incomplete catechesis – you name it – can lead Catholics astray. It seems so obvious what they need to do to get back on track, but they believe they are just fine, that you don't understand, or that there is no point to coming back.

So, what CAN you do? First, stop upsetting yourself by taking their situation on as your problem to solve. Instead, live your faith, be a good Catholic, go to Mass, pray Novenas, pray the Rosary, go to Confession, go to Adoration, enjoy what you love about being Catholic. Pray for those who are away, love them, and invite the Holy Spirit and Saints to intercede for them. Remember God is in control. God loves you and them, more than you know, and He works for good always, but in His own time. Be an example to them by how you live your life and then let the Holy Spirit do the rest.

Someone was praying for me. I don't know who or why, but when I finally realized what I was missing, I couldn't come back fast enough! My return to the faith after 30 years being away is proof that miracles still do happen. Have faith, trust in the Lord and love those who are away from the Church, as Jesus taught us to do! Matthew 11:28-30 says, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

We have a lot to be proud of here at St Brendan, and we have a lot to be thankful for. Have a great week!



CARDINAL LUIS TAGLE'S CLOSING HOMILY OF THE EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS (PART 3 – "YOU CAN BE HAPPY")

After the departure of some disciples, Jesus asked the twelve apostles, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Jesus is asking each one of us, "Do you also want to leave me like the others?" I hope we can answer like Peter, "We will stay with you, Lord. We refuse to live far from your presence." But let these not be empty words. Like Peter, we should believe with conviction.

Jesus does not impose Himself on anyone. He appeals to our interior freedom. Faith and conviction are our gifts to Jesus, who gives Himself to us. So I ask you, dear brothers and sisters, will you stay with Jesus? Those who choose to stay with Jesus will be sent by Jesus. The gift of His presence and love for us will be our gift to people. We should not keep Jesus to ourselves. That is not discipleship. That is selfishness. The gift we have received, we should give as a gift.

Have you experienced the tenderness of Jesus toward His tired disciples, offering them time to rest and to eat, as recounted in the Gospel today? Go and share Jesus' tender love to the weary, the hungry, and the suffering. Have you experienced Jesus' compassion and guidance when you were like sheep without a shepherd? Go and share Jesus' shepherd's caress to the lost, confused and weak. Have you experienced Jesus' wounded heart uniting those who are separated from each other, as St Paul states in his letter to the Ephesians? Go and share Jesus' gift of reconciliation and peace to those who are divided.

In his letter to me, Pope Francis expressed the hope, and I quote, "that the participants of the Congress, fully aware of the universal gifts they receive from heavenly food, may impart them to others." Fully aware of the gifts they have received from the heavenly food, may they impart them to others. So a Eucharistic people is a missionary and evangelizing people.

Let me close by sharing an experience. When I was a parish priest, I noticed a woman who was extraordinarily devoted to the church. On Sundays, she arrived early in the morning, to help in all the Masses and other activities, and went home only when the church had been cleaned up and the doors closed. One day, I thanked her for her dedication, and I also thanked her family for allowing her to serve. Her answer surprised me. She said, "Father, do not worry about my family. 




