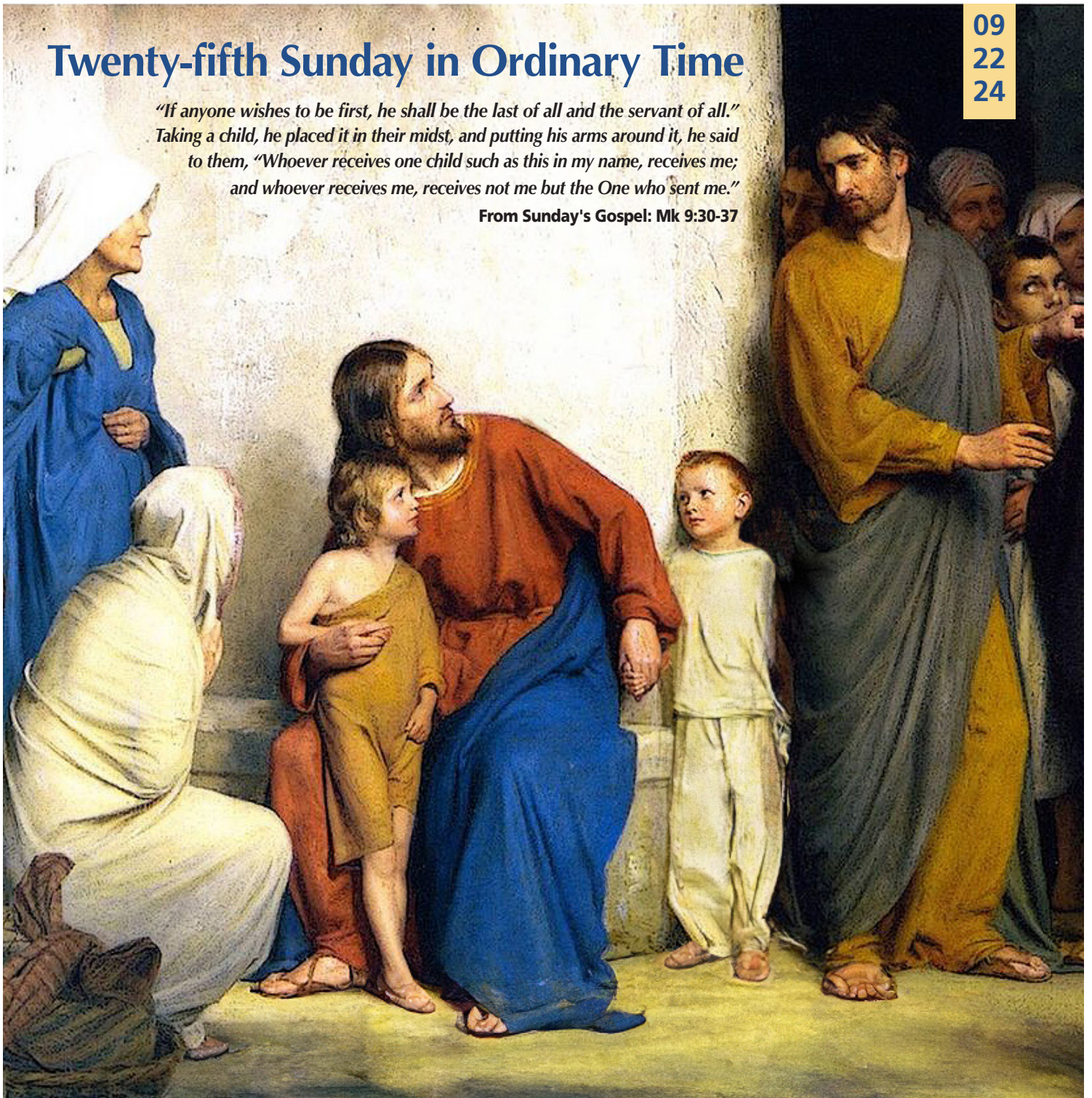


Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

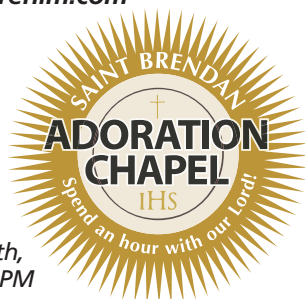

A MESSAGE FROM FR WELDIT

Last Sunday, our Catholic Ge'ez Rite celebrated our New Year and the Feast of St John the Baptist. The Ge'ez calendar marks a new Eritrean and Ethiopian year on September 1, which is the Feast of John the Baptist in the Ge'ez Rite. This date relates with biblical and natural creation and ushers in the beginning of a new year! This year, our celebration was named after Saint Matthew. The naming of each year in the Ge'ez calendar is represented by one of the four Evangelists: Saint Matthew, Saint Mark, Saint Luke and Saint John; in remembrance and honor of each of their roles in preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ through their writings and sermons. John was the last of the prophets and a viaduct between the Old and New Testament. His message in his Gospel highlights the transition from the Old Testament to the New Testament, ushering in salvation and new life in Our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Ge'ez New Year also marks the transition from the heavy rainy season to the luminous one. It is symbolic of the passage from an awe-inspiring night into a beautiful morning. Our New Year celebration is also an occasion of exchanging gifts and good wishes amongst people. A typical New Year's greeting reads: "May He take you safely from the year of John to the year of Matthew!" (Depending on the Evangelists after whom the outgoing and incoming years are named). The entire month of September is a time of blissful happiness! In our country, this holiday is celebrated with family, friends and neighbors, filled with sacrificial lambs, fresh coffee and delicious food. It is common to see markets and shops crowded, especially early in the holiday.

Our Ethiopian calendar was fixed to the Julian calendar in 25 BC by Roman Emperor Augustus and the date for our new year marks the approximate end of the rainy season, adding to the symbolism of it being the beginning of something new. It is a time for blooming flowers, sunny days and pleasant weather, allowing people to leave the rainy, foggy and thunderous months behind and move on to better days. Similarly, in the Eritrean context, especially in the rural areas, September is also the beginning of sunny weather in which crops are gathered and harvested, after toiling all summer. It's also during this month that flowers blossom after heavy rains and why this new beginning is cause for jovial celebration. During this time, most of the pastoralists who had left with their livestock return home.

The Ethiopian Calendar, also known as the Ge'ez or Ethiopic Calendar, which is used in the African country, is currently 7-8 years behind the Gregorian calendar that's used by the rest of the world. This calendar has 13 months instead of 12, with the last one being known as Pagume (which translates to "forgotten" in Greek.) Ethiopia is currently in its calendar year 2017. The Ge'ez Rite's feast of St John the Baptist is the first day of the first month of the new year, September 1, but in the Gregorian calendar it is celebrated on September 11 or 12.

Saint John is considered an end-times prophet – the closer of the Old Testament and opener of the New Testament. He conducted his ministry with an eschatological authority and taught that judgment is at hand. In the Gospel, John prepares the way for Jesus and proclaims His coming in fulfillment of the prophecy. He introduced the Lamb of God to the world and led the way for Jesus by his preaching, baptism of repentance, and a new life in Christ.

Our new year celebration and prayers are symbolically represented to embody John's Gospel message. Before the new year begins, in the 13th month of Pagume (which lasts only 5 or 6 days), people go down to the river to wash and to renew their Baptism, "cleansing" away old sinful behaviors and entering into a new life to begin the new year. Every year, in the month of Pagume, all Christians gather, attend church and pray that God may bless the year ahead and forgive sins of the past. We pray, in the name of God, to save us from illnesses, make us holy, and make our future life blessed, as we share in the life of Christ, who is the righteousness and light of our lives. We light a torch and spread the lit flame around our homes, neighborhoods, villages, and make the sign of the cross with it as a symbol of the light of Christ. We come out of the darkness which has clung to our lives and character in the past year and enter into the new year ahead with our lives fully centered in Christ!



Continuing with our *Walk with One* series, remember that the most important initiative of this third Eucharistic Year is to walk alongside those who are seeking, away from the faith, or on the edges – in our families, with friends, coworkers, or others in the community. We will support you with resources along the way, but it begins with prayer and relationship.

The first two steps were to identify someone in a spirit of humility and intercede for them in communion with the Holy Spirit. The next step is to connect in Eucharistic friendship.

Look for ways to accompany the person you have prayed for, to build a deeper relationship, and to practice the art of empathetic listening. Eucharistic friendship builds upon the dynamic that Jesus revealed in His relationships with the disciples and, above all, at the Last Supper – He takes bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it. It is important to take or receive what the other person has to share, to bless and lift it up in prayer, to let the Holy Spirit help break open an area for potential growth, then to give of yourself in response. It is also important to recognize that this may not be a one and done conversation but is more likely to be a series of conversations and invitations, developing a real friendship with that person. Find an appropriate time to begin growing in your friendship, perhaps over coffee or lunch. Listen deeply for promptings from the Holy Spirit as you get to know your friend's joys and struggles. Share with them some of your own.

Listen respectfully when the conversation turns to spiritual matters, including their relationship with God and questions or concerns about the Church, and reserve judgment about their opinions. Some people might be ready to discuss the spiritual life after only a conversation or two, while for others it might take more time.

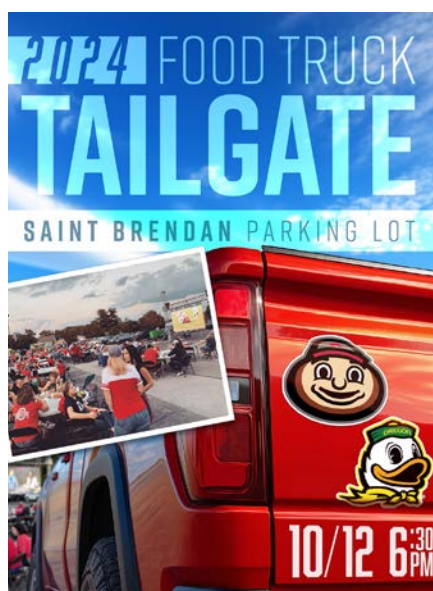

"My wife just had a baby and hasn't been able to work and then I had a car accident in July. I've been working two jobs, but the extra costs from the accident have me short on money for rent and due to repair costs and my wife being unable to work right now, we can't manage. Will you help?"

"I hate that I need to ask for assistance, but am retired and living in a senior apartment complex. I moved here 5 years ago to be closer to my medical treatments at Ohio State. 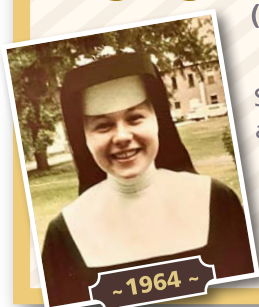

Faithful Citizenship: Solidarity

In *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, the Catholic bishops of the U.S. identify the four main principles of the Church's social teaching—Dignity of the Human Person, the Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity—and apply them to concrete issues. This entry focuses on Solidarity.



Solidarity is "a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to . . . the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all."¹ We are one human family, whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. Human beings are social in nature; we develop and flourish within a community. As baptized members of the community of the Church, we are part of one body in Christ and one global human family.²

Solidarity requires that in our prayer and in our political engagement, those who are weak, vulnerable, and most in need receive preferential concern. We are called to practice "radical solidarity" by:

- Accompanying women to choose life and supporting new mothers and their children.³
- Advocating for families and individuals affected by poverty, unemployment, sickness, mental illness, addiction, the elderly, and those with disabilities.
- Aiding victims of war and supporting peace initiatives, particularly in Ukraine, West Africa, and the Middle East.⁴
- Seeking policies that "welcome, protect, promote, and integrate" migrants and refugees who arrive at our borders and which aid development in countries of origin.⁵
- Confronting racism as an obstacle to solidarity, examining our hearts, policies, and institutions.⁶
- Critiquing a culture that prioritizes accumulation of wealth over human dignity and integral development.⁷

As we seek to foster solidarity in hearts and policies, let us pray with Pope Francis:

*Lord, Father of our human family . . . Move us to create healthier societies and a more dignified world, a world without hunger, poverty, violence and war. Amen.*⁸

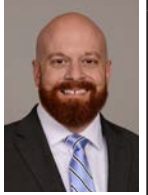




