



SECONDARY COLLECTIONS

Parish families stepped up to support 21 additional outreach initiatives and secondary collections in FY 2023-24. Gifts made through the parish office or PushPay totaled \$153,606! By the grace of God, we are nearing the end of 2024, and as we look ahead to the new year, 2025, we do so with hope and joy. As Christmas approaches, let us prepare our hearts to receive the good news of Christ's birth, while also giving thanks for the blessings of the past year and praying for Christ to be born anew in our hearts.

Faith is a living experience—once we encounter it, we cannot remain indifferent. It is a gift available to everyone. Over the past year, I have learned so much about faith, generosity, prayer, love, and friendship, especially from both the St Brendan community and the Eritrean faithful who so warmly welcomed me. When I first arrived, I was taken aback by the talent and dedication of the Eritrean community. I witnessed how they elevated the liturgy by inviting priests from all around to celebrate major holidays. Our



people have found great joy and happiness in their worship, particularly using musical instruments.

The Second Vatican Council described the musical tradition of the universal Church as a treasure of great value, greater than any other art form. Sacred music becomes even more sacred when it is closely tied to liturgical action. As the council emphasized, music expresses the "soul of the people" and should be promoted, especially in the singing of liturgical texts. [Sacrosanctum Concilium]

Thanks to the generous support from the Catholic Foundation, last year we were blessed with vestments and other items that have become an important source of encouragement for our growing congregation. This year, we were further blessed to receive \$4,000 from the Catholic Foundation, which we have used to purchase musical instruments for the church choir. It fills my heart with joy to see our children growing in faith, eagerly stepping forward to worship and praise God with sweet songs and prayers.

FROM DIR. OF EVANGELIZATION & CATECHESIS, JACOB DORAN

Our Family Faith Formation program this year serves **250** children from over **150** families. We have families in the Seek & Root course who have children that are just starting their journey of faith formation. Other families are working to prepare their children for first Reconciliation, first Holy Communion, and Confirmation. Finally, there are also families in the Continued Growth course that are learning about and doing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

In the whole parish (both family faith formation and the school) we will have 103 students make their first Reconciliation and Holy Communion and another 86 celebrate their Confirmation.



FROM HIGH SCHOOL MINISTER, KARA DAY

The Vine high school youth ministry program continues to flourish here at St Brendan. So far in the 2024-25 school year, 246 high schoolers have attended The Vine. Every single week, new faces join us for their first time. The Vine is impacting the city at-large, reaching youth from 27 different high schools. 21% of the teens attending The Vine were not raised Catholic. As a result, this year we have started an OCIA group for those who are interested in becoming Catholic. Dozens of high schoolers also regularly attend daily Mass at St Brendan on Friday mornings before class.

This year, we have a record number of 63 high school leaders who are in our High School Missionary Formation program where they learn how to share Jesus with their friends. The teens in this program are set up to be lifelong missionary disciples who do not fall

Winter Mission Trip and Vine Spring Retreat. God continues to bless our youth ministry each day.

This year, our middle school ministry, The Roots, served roughly 105 middle schoolers by providing the children of our faith community with a place to have fun, build relationships with peers, and grow their faith. With the help of parent volunteers we have been able to offer the youth a home-cooked meal made with love and intention. This year, with our 7 Core Team members, we have prayed for each youth by name, offering up their prayer intentions in front of the blessed sacrament each month.

Our middle school small groups, Aspen, served 18 youth. Each pod of 6-8 youth have a pair of adult leaders to help them dive deeper into their faith. This deeper encounter with Christ includes joining the Vine most evenings for worship and adoration. We look

forward to next year as we continue to nurture the love of Christ growing in our middle schoolers, provide a safe environment to meet new friends, and bring additional youth into the fold.

FROM DIR. OF MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP. JEN RICE

This year has been one of new prayer, formation, community, and service opportunities as we continue into the third year of the Eucharistic Revival — a Year of Mission. We are engaging in prayer more than ever with Adoration, now offered 63 hours a week over 7 days. Our First Friday overnight Adoration is now in its second year! We are beginning to expand our prayer teams and deepen our understanding and practice of intercessory prayer with workshops and other offerings.

Adult faith formation continues to thrive as 250 women and men experienced The Chosen, That Man Is You, Eucharistic, and Scripture studies in small groups and special events to grow in their knowledge and love of Jesus, then take these gifts out on mission to serve others in need. We recognize the need to seek the lost and invite others to find

Jesus here, increasing our outreach with the St. Monica Prayer service and ongoing follow-up events and education through Inviting Catholics Home.

On the pastoral care side, our Care & Consolation team supported 32 families in their time of bereavement through planning and presence at funerals of loved ones as well as grief support thereafter. 250 homebound or retirement center residents were visited weekly to receive the Eucharist and we continue to supply them with monthly publications of daily scripture readings and reflections. We actively ministered in 17 independent, assisted living, and nursing facilities.

I am so excited to be a part of St Brendan! It has been a great start to the 2024-25 school year and it has been a blessing working with our faculty, staff, parents, parish, and most importantly, our students! I get so much energy from them.

Our collaborative parish, St Margaret of Cortona, continues to be a great source of joy for me as I enjoy finding new ways to serve every Thursday. The preschool has reached

record enrollment en route to adding a **new classroom** and **full-day** programming. I can't speak highly enough of the wonderful staff, and would strongly encourage any young families to consider St Margaret Preschool.

Highlighting the Emmaus Road Scholarship Fund has become my December tradition. There is simply no method more efficient in supporting this campus and its school families. Those who give to Emmaus Road receive a dollar-for-dollar state tax credit, meaning you can create a scholarship with money you would have otherwise paid into taxes anyway! We inspired 139 families (myself included) to create \$132,260 in scholarships for this current school year. Across a campus of 2,500 families, we could make a Catholic education virtually free. Please join me in seizing this admittedly unbelievable opportunity. It's very real!

I'm tremendously blessed to be a member of this remarkable parish staff that is made possible by a famously generous faith family. Our clergy, staff, faculty, volunteers, and parishioners all coalesce to build the Kingdom of God brick by brick.
