# **Message from Jennifer Rice**

We have arrived. After five weeks of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we stand at the entrance of the Holy City to accompany Jesus and bear witness to His journey to Calvary. Remember the beginning of Lent, ready to pounce and do all the things that would rend our hearts and make us new creations by Easter? Then, somewhere around week 3 or 4, we start to weary a bit and may "slip" off the path. We may get upset with ourselves for not making this the



"best Lent ever" and have regrets that the weeks have passed so quickly without gathering the fruit we had once seen so clearly in our view.

Hear me now in my best mother-of-boys voice: "DON'T DO THAT!"

**God sees you.** He sees all of your triumphs and challenges, all of your boxes checked and those left untouched. He has stood close when you have prayed or fallen asleep doing so, fasted or had to have just one Diet Coke, helped your neighbor or missed an opportunity. Past all of these, God sees into your heart and your beautiful intention to come closer to Him and do better. Rest in that a bit.

One of my favorite verses is Lamentations 3:22-23: *The steadfast love* of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning... I know that however I messed up the day before or how things went in that tough fourth week of Lent, I can try again. God is merciful in His work with us. He reminds me of my dad teaching me to ride a bike (and no training wheels stage either). Running alongside, holding onto the seat, letting me go, scooping me back up when I fall off, again and again. "Let's try again, Jenny." Let US try again.

Holy Week is a gift of a new morning in our Lenten journey toward Easter. This week, we can choose to continue our Lenten

commitments with vigor. We can spend precious time with our Lord in prayer in the unplugged silence of our church, chapel, homes, or in nature. We can soak up the wealth of ritual and God coming so close to us in the celebration of the Sacred Triduum. We can fast reverently on Good Friday, contemplating His ultimate sacrifice for us.

Dig in, my friends. This is all preparation for our someday with God in eternity. Oh how our Father cheers for us – **let Him guide you toward the Alleluia of Easter.** 

## **Reconciliation Monday**

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, making it an ideal time for us to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Reconciliation Monday is April 14 from 6-8 PM. This is the last opportunity for scheduled Confession before Easter!



# WALK WITH ONE

#### "Why We Need Prayer" (Part 1) by Tod Worner

As we approach Easter, we may find ourselves already missing our loved ones who won't be with us at Mass because they have left the Church or have not yet found their way here. In this first of two excerpts from Tod Worner's "*Why We Need Prayer*," we are reminded that in the gap between doing all we can do and the hoped-for outcome, God is standing.

Robert Barron emphasizes the oft-overlooked passage from the Gospel of Mark, "They were on the way, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus went ahead of them. They were amazed and those who followed were afraid" (Mark 10:32). The God whom we engage in prayer—the God who overcomes the gap—is amazing, fearsome, wondrous. If only we will talk with Him.

If we are to begin being effective Catholic missionaries, shouldn't we pray and, as St Paul insists, "pray without ceasing" (1 Thes 5:17)? If we are a Missionary Faith, shouldn't we seek, listen, and follow the Founder of our Mission? Then we must pray. If we are to be Agents of Grace—conduits of Christ's love and mercy to the world shouldn't we have an unimpeded connection to the Source of Grace? Then we must pray. God is the parent marveling at His dignified children in their freedom, but He is hungry to help. And He offers the constant father's refrain: "Don't worry. I can help."

#### Prayer matters.

St John Paul II exclaimed, "We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song!" And the beloved Pope Benedict XVI assured, "The one who has hope lives differently." These are entreaties to joy, encouragements to hope. To be sure, between our Catholic missionary efforts and God's perfect plan, there is a gap. We simply cannot do it alone. May prayer help us trust, hope, and love the God who overcomes the gap and the many souls He is entrusting to our passionate evangelization.

## Hilliard Food Pantry Green Bin Donations

Do you know where the "GREEN BIN" is in the Gathering Area? It's at the far end, down by the music room! The left side is for donating to JOIN (Joint Organization for Inter-City Needs) and the right side is for donations to the Hilliard Food Pantry (HFP).

# Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

as Passion

Is 50:4-7 | Phil 2:6-11 | Lk 22:14—23:56

**GROW** AS A DISCIPLE | pray, study, engage, serve More than any other time of year, we are able to follow the actual events of Jesus' life this week according to the sequence in which they occurred. Today's procession with palms honors his entry into Jerusalem, where he would prepare to celebrate the Passover with his disciples. We can imagine Jesus spending the subsequent days preaching in the Temple and the nights conversing with his Father in prayer. Then, on Thursday, the Mass of the Lord's Supper will inaugurate the Triduum, the time which commemorates Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection. The Church places these events before our eyes each year as an invitation to enter as fully as possible into Jesus' mind and heart during Holy Week. Even if we regret not being more faithful to the goals we established at the beginning of Lent, we can still seize the opportunity of this week to accompany Jesus as he prepares to die for love of us.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The crowds of followers who welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem triumphantly today will be silent by Friday. Among his closest disciples, all will fall asleep during his prayer of agony on the Mount of Olives. Peter himself, who says on Holy Thursday, "I am prepared to go to prison and to die with you," will deny three times that he knew Jesus. The chief priests and scribes (who, one would think, should have recognized the Messiah) will deliver him to Pilate to be crucified. In each of these examples, love for Jesus (or, in the case of the priests and scribes, fidelity to God) is tested and found wanting during Holy Week. Of course, we know that Jesus still proceeded to die so that salvation would be available to *all* of these people. He likewise made it possible for every future generation - including our own - to return to him in moments when we find our own love wanting. We do this by turning away from sin and seeking his forgiveness, especially in the sacrament of confession. Therefore, let us, who have acclaimed Jesus as king today, keep him as king of our hearts - not only this week, but every day of our lives.
