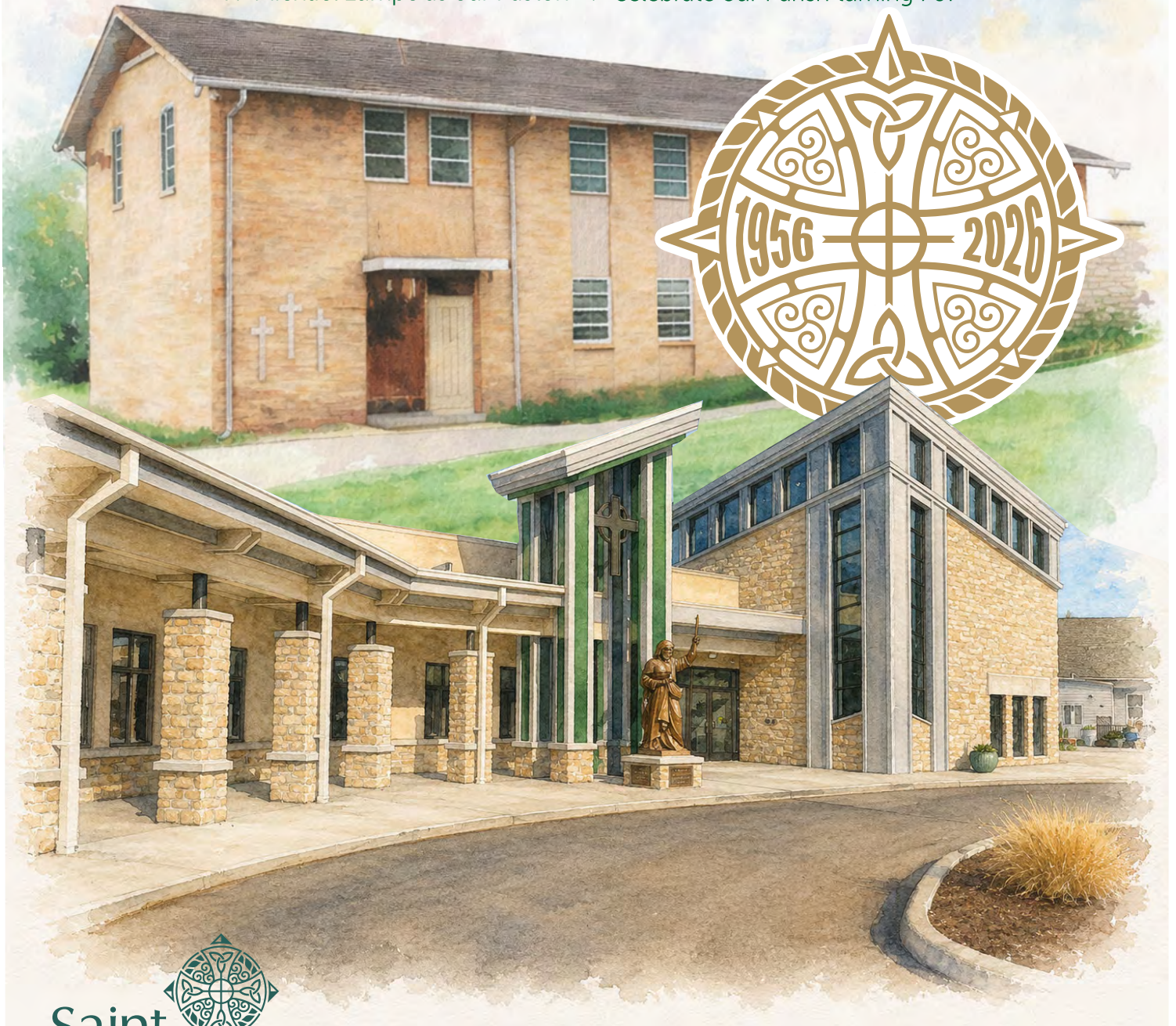

From Our Pastor

MY DEAR FRIENDS IN CHRIST JESUS,

This Sunday, we celebrate the 70th Anniversary of the Founding of our Parish. In doing so, we stand on the shoulders of giants – the men and women who founded our beloved parish. For seven decades, this parish has been a beacon of faith, a sanctuary of hope, and a home for generations of families and souls seeking the Lord. Seventy years of Baptisms, Confessions, First Communions, Confirmations, weddings, Anointing of the Sick, the Last Rites, funerals, daily prayers, Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and countless Masses. Wellnitz Hall – the original Church – and the walls of our current Church are soaked in prayer. Our Parish School has decades of “the first day of school” and an equal number of graduations, sending forth our young men and women to be heralds of the Gospel by what they have learned from our teachers and catechists. Call it what you wish and remember from different eras – CCD, PSR, Family Faith Formation – countless numbers of young men and women have been formed in the faith to be heralds of the Gospel as well. Let’s not forget the decades of Youth, Young Adult and Adult Faith Formation programs and activities, RCIA/OCIA, and countless ministry and social groups — Knights of Columbus, Saint Vincent de Paul, Senior groups, Men’s and Women’s groups, Bible studies, Scouts, Athletics, and dozens more. None of this would have been possible if it were not for the men and women who founded our parish. Today, we look back with immense gratitude for these men and women – the majority of whom have been called home by the Lord – who built this parish community, and we look forward with burning zeal for the future God is preparing for us.

It is beautifully fitting that our parish is placed under the heavenly patronage of Saint Brendan the Navigator. Saint Brendan was a sixth-century Celtic monk known for his daring voyages into the vast, uncharted Atlantic Ocean, centuries before Christopher Columbus and other explorers. He and his fellow monks set sail in a simple, fragile boat made of wood and leather. They did not have modern maps, a sextant nor GPS. They had something far more reliable – an unshakable faith in the providence of Almighty God. Saint Brendan set sail not knowing where the wind would take him, but in faith, knew exactly *Who* held the wind in His hands.

For 70 years, our parish has been living out that exact same voyager spirit of faith.

Think back to the founding families who gathered here seven decades ago. They, too, were stepping out into the deep. They poured their hearts, their resources, and their sacrifices into creating a spiritual home from scratch in the farmlands that once surrounded our sprawling campus today. Like Saint Brendan’s crew, they faced uncertainties, economic shifts, and the changing tides of culture. Yet, because their anchor was firmly cast in Jesus Christ, the stormy seas could not capsize them. This parish survived and thrived because it was built on the rock of the timeless teachings of Jesus Christ, His sacraments – especially the Eucharist – and steered by the Holy Spirit.

But a parish anniversary is never just about looking at old photographs or celebrating the brick and mortar of our buildings. A parish is not a museum; it is a ship on a mission – each of us shares in that mission today.

Saint Brendan and his monks did not sail just to enjoy a sunny day on the water and sightsee. They sailed to bring the light and truths of the Gospel to uncharted territories. Today, Jesus looks at each of us and gives us the exact same command He gave to the Apostles on the Sea of Galilee: “*Duc in altum*” – put out into the deep.

We live in a world where many people are spiritually adrift. They are tossed and turned on oceans of anxiety, loneliness, confusion, and despair, with little or no connection to Jesus. They search for purpose, meaning and direction that can only be found in the harbor of our Savior Jesus Christ. Our job as the living stones of Saint Brendan’s Parish is to be part of Christ’s harbor. We are called to step outside our comfort zones, untie our boats from the safety of the dock, and sail into the lives of our neighbors, friends, coworkers, and total strangers, and bring them to the truths and love of Jesus.

As we celebrate 70 years of faith, fellowship, and Christ’s abundant graces, let us remember the Mass Collect on his feast day:

O God, who helped Saint Brendan navigate the seas in his eagerness to spread the Gospel, grant us, at his intercession, on our journey through life to set our course according to Your peace and bring us to the harbor we desire in Heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

My brothers and sisters, our voyage is far from over. The same Holy Spirit that filled the sails of Saint Brendan, and the same Spirit that inspired our founders 70 years ago, is filling each one of our sails today. Let us renew our commitment to this wonderful parish family. Let us bring our youth, our families, our seniors, our ill and infirm, and all who seek Christ together, into the boat. With Christ at the helm, and Saint Brendan interceding for us, let us boldly set sail into the next 70 years.

From the entire staff at Saint Brendan’s, may abundant and choice blessings be upon you and your families.

St. Brendan Parish Celebrates 70 Years!

A HISTORICAL OVERVIEW OF OUR CHURCH AND SCHOOL...

St. Brendan the Navigator Parish has a rich history that reflects back to **1956** when this area of west Columbus was just beginning its growth spurt. As the area's population expanded, there was also an increase in the number of Catholics and Bishop Michael Ready addressed their spiritual needs by adding St. Brendan as a new Diocesan Parish. St. Brendan was selected as the parish name and as our patron saint. This name held from 1956 until 2003, when the name was formally changed to St. Brendan the Navigator.

The first pastor of our parish was Fr. Michael Wellnitz, and the early membership of the parish was about 65 families. Fr. Wellnitz, an accomplished wood carver, left his mark on St. Brendan when he carved the Stations of the Cross (currently on display along the wall adjacent to the Davidson Rooms) and the five-foot statues of Jesus, Mary, Joseph, and St. Anthony that reside in our church today.

In **1957**, the original church and rectory were combined into what is now Wellnitz Hall, with the church on the lower level and the rectory upstairs. For a number of years, the upstairs of that building was used as our parish offices and the large room in the lower level is where Bible studies were conducted before it was turned into the current storage room.¹

St. Brendan School opened its doors on September 4, **1963** for grades five through eight.² The cafeteria, also used as the gym, and kitchen were completed in **1965**. By **1970**, the school accommodated approximately 170 students in grades one through eight. With the addition of the school, they also added a larger church area connected to the school to accommodate the growing parish population. The combination church and school building was purposely designed so the church portion of the building could be converted into additional school classrooms as warranted by parish growth. The space was converted to classrooms in **1972** and the church moved back to the rectory basement (which is now the Wellnitz Hall storage room).

Msgr. William Maroon became Pastor of St. Brendan in **1978**. The following year launched a capital campaign to begin the process of building a new St. Brendan Church. The dedication of the new church took place in **1981**, the 25th anniversary year for St. Brendan parish.³

In **1987**, the growth of the community-at-large led to the development of two new parishes in the area: St. Brigid of Kildare in Dublin and St. Joan of Arc in Powell. Even though our parish was divided among the new parishes, St. Brendan parish continued to add more families.

In **1993**, Monsignor William Maroon returned as our Pastor and began the expansion of St. Brendan School with a capital campaign to add a multipurpose room/gym and ten additional classrooms. In **1995**, there was also an expansion to the church that added a new gathering area, additional pews, a new cry room, and an immersion baptismal font.⁴

In **1998**, St. Brendan added the rectory for the priests which exists today.⁵ This rectory accommodates both our resident priests and visiting priests. Behind the current rectory, a large stone table still sits that was once used as an altar for summertime Masses. That same year, they also remodeled the old rectory garage and created the Carter Center, which was originally used as our nursery for children, named after Fr. Raymond Carter who served as our Parochial Vicar for many years.

In **2001**, two rooms were added by the school cafeteria, and in **2002**, the Maroon Center was added to the church to house additional offices and a library. That area now serves as the room where liturgical ministers prepare for Mass as well as offices for our Care and Consolation ministers, our Deacon offices and an office for our music director.

In **2004**, St. Brendan School added a Kindergarten class, held in the Carter Center (which was formerly the Rectory garage!) In **2007**, Kindergarten moved into the main building, housed in half of the Cafeteria Annex.

On June 30, **2019**, the parish broke ground on the Navigator Expansion through funds raised during the "ONE Campaign." These additions included our Adoration Chapel, the Davidson Rooms, new parish and school offices, a new school media center as well as uniting our church to our school where there once had been a roadway that separated the two buildings... fulfilling the unifying goal of the ONE Campaign. The old parish offices (Wellnitz Hall upper floor) were turned into two large meeting rooms with the kitchenette and the old lower level Hall in the basement became much needed storage.⁶



ST. BRENDAN THE NAVIGATOR PARISH, THEN, NOW, AND INTO THE FUTURE...

The St. Brendan parish community has continued to thrive since its inception through the dedicated involvement of the parishioners; over the years, parishioners have participated in vibrant social and philanthropic groups as well as groups that have focused on evangelization and catechesis. We also have a history of events such as the parish festival, fundraising sales, raffles, etc., which are designed for family participation and expanded to include the community-at-large. Groups and events have evolved over the years to meet the changing needs of our parish family and they will continue to do so as our faith community expands.

St. Brendan Parish Fun-facts:

The ceiling design of our sanctuary replicates the tent the Hebrews pitched each night for God as they continued on their journey in search of the Promised Land. Our altar is made from five tons of granite with relics from Saints Florentius and Aurelius buried within it. On the surface of the altar, five crosses are engraved into the stone, one placed at each of its corners and one in the center. These five crosses represent the five wounds of Jesus.

Prayer of Saint Brendan

This beautiful prayer is attributed to St. Brendan the Navigator (484-577 A.D.), also known as St. Brendan the Voyager, an ancient Irish monk, abbot, sailor, ship-builder, and explorer. He is the patron saint of mariners, sailors, travelers, and the U.S. Navy. It is believed by some historians that the holy abbot, eager to spread the Gospel to unknown lands, with the winds of the Holy Spirit in his sails, traveled by boat to North America – making him the very first explorer to set foot on her shores. Some say it was the legend of St. Brendan's Voyage that prompted Christopher Columbus to launch his own attempt to discover the New World a thousand years later.

Lord, I will trust You, help me to journey beyond the familiar and into the unknown. Give me the faith to leave old ways and break fresh ground with You. Christ of the mysteries, I trust You to be stronger than each storm within me. I will trust in the darkness and know that my times are in Your hand. St. Brendan set sail with a band of friends in search of the Holy Island. The following prayer is attributed to him as he considers this perilous journey. As each of us considers the call of God in our own lives, this prayer might offer a way of seeking and waiting on the Lord.

(Prayer translated by Robert Van De Weyer)

*Shall I abandon, O King of mysteries, the soft comforts of home?
 Shall I turn my back on my native land, and turn my face towards the sea?
 Shall I put myself wholly at your mercy, without silver, without a horse,
 without fame, without honour?
 Shall I throw myself wholly upon you, without sword and shield,
 without food and drink, without a bed to lie on?
 Shall I say farewell to my beautiful land, placing myself under your yoke?
 Shall I pour out my heart to you, confessing my manifold sins and
 begging forgiveness, tears streaming down my cheeks?
 Shall I leave the prints of my knees on the sandy beach, a record of my

SAINT BRENDAN'S CROSS

The Saint Brendan's 4 Fishes Cross (also known as the Irish Fish Cross) is an ancient Celtic symbol where four stylized fish (or dolphins/whales) meet at the center to form a cross. Rooted in both Christian theology and Irish seafaring history, it holds multiple layers of meaning.

Symbolism of Saint Brendan's Cross:

THE 4 CORNERS OF THE EARTH:

The four fish radiating outward represent the Christian commission to spread the Gospel message to the four corners of the world. This aligns with Saint Brendan's historical legacy as an adventurous evangelist who took the Bible's command quite literally.

THE ICHTHYS (JESUS FISH):

The fish themselves are ancient Christian symbols. In early Christianity, the fish was a secret sign of faith and identification among believers.


NAVIGATION BY THE HEAVENS:

The cross design in the center resembles a compass rose, honoring Brendan's patron status as the patron saint of sailors and travelers.

CREATION & STEWARDSHIP:

St. Brendan is uniquely the patron saint of both mariners and whales. The four fish represent not only his followers but also the creatures of the deep he famously encountered (and protected) during his legendary Atlantic voyages.

Lectio Divina

The whole function of the life of prayer is, then, to enlighten and strengthen our conscience so that it not only knows and perceives the outward, written precepts of the moral and divine laws, but above all lives God’s law in concrete reality by perfect and continual union with His will.”

Monday, June 15 ~ Eleventh Week in the Season of Ordinary Time

Holy Gospel: Matthew 5:38-42 Jesus said to his disciples: “You have heard that it was said, / *An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.* / But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one to him as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand him your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go with him for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow.”

Meditation: Jesus does something quite remarkable in today’s gospel – He transforms the law of mercy with grace and loving kindness. Jesus also makes clear that there is no room for retaliation, which is an all-too-human response to particular types of challenge. We must not only avoid returning evil for evil, but we must seek the good of those who wish us ill. Do you accept insults, as Jesus did, with no resentment or malice? When you are compelled by others to do more than you think you deserve, do you insist on your rights, or do you respond with grace and cheerfulness? What makes a Christian different from everyone else? What makes Christianity distinct from any other religion? It is grace - treating others, not as they deserve, but as God wishes them to be treated - with loving-kindness and mercy. Only the cross of Jesus Christ can free us from the tyranny of malice, hatred, revenge, and resentment and gives us the courage to return evil with good. Such love and grace has power to heal and to save from destruction. Do you know the power of Christ’s redeeming love and mercy?

Prayer: O God, strength of those who hope in you, graciously hear our pleas, and, since without you mortal frailty can do nothing, grant us always the help of your grace, that in following your commands we may please you by our resolve and our deeds. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: If someone insults you or tries to take advantage of you, how do you respond? Do you repay in kind? Jesus approached the question of just retribution with a surprising revelation of God’s intention for how we should treat others, especially those who mistreat us. When Jesus spoke about God’s law, he did something no one had done before. He gave a new standard based not just on the requirements of justice (i.e. giving each their due), but based on the law of grace and love. Jesus knew the law and its intention better than any jurist or legal expert could imagine. He quoted from the oldest recorded law in the world: If any harm follows, then you shall give life for life, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot, burn for burn, wound for wound, stripe for stripe (Exodus 21:23-25). Such a law today seems cruel, but it was meant to limit vengeance as a first step towards mercy. This law was not normally taken literally but served as a guide for a judge in a law court for assessing punishment and penalty (ref. Deuteronomy 19:18).

Tuesday, June 16 ~ Eleventh Week in the Season of Ordinary Time

Holy Gospel: Matthew 5:43-48 Jesus said to his disciples: “You have heard that it was said, / *You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.* / But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad

and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect.”

Meditation: Think about what Jesus was saying when He said that each of us must be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect. The original meaning of “perfect” in Aramaic is “completeness” or “wholeness – not lacking in what is essential.” God gives us every good gift in Jesus Christ so that we may not lack anything we need to do his will and to live as his sons and daughters. He knows our weakness and sinfulness better than we do. And he assures us of his love, mercy, and grace to follow in his ways. Do you want to grow in your love for God and for your neighbor? Ask the Holy Spirit to change and transform you in the image of the Father that you may walk in the joy and freedom of the gospel.

Prayer: O God, strength of those who hope in you, graciously hear our pleas, and, since without you mortal frailty can do nothing, grant us always the help of your grace, that in following your commands we may please you by our resolve and our deeds. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: What makes Christians different from others and what makes Christianity distinct from any other religion? It is grace – treating others, not as they deserve, but as God wishes them to be treated – with loving-kindness and mercy. God is good to the unjust as well as the just. His love embraces saint and sinner alike. God seeks our highest good and teaches us to seek the greatest good of others, even those who hate and abuse us. Our love for others, even those who are ungrateful and selfish towards us, must be marked by the same kindness and mercy which God has shown to us. It is easier to show kindness and mercy when we can expect to benefit from doing so. How much harder when we can expect nothing in return. Our prayer for those who do us ill both breaks the power of revenge and releases the power of love to do good in the face of evil. How can we possibly love those who cause us harm or ill-will? With God all things are possible. He gives power and grace to those who believe and accept the gift of the Holy Spirit. His love conquers all, even our hurts, fears, prejudices and sorrows. Only the cross of Jesus Christ can free us from the tyranny of malice, hatred, revenge, and resentment and gives us the courage to return evil with good. Such love and grace holds power to heal and to save from destruction. Have you experienced the power of Christ’s redeeming love and mercy?

Wednesday, June 17 ~ Eleventh Week in the Season of Ordinary Time

Holy Gospel: 6:1-6,16-18 Jesus said to his disciples: “Take care not to perform righteous deeds in order that people may see them; otherwise, you will have no recompense from your heavenly Father. When you give alms, do not blow a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets to win the praise of others. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right is doing, so that your almsgiving may be secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you.

“When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, who love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on street corners so that others may see them. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you.

“When you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites. They neglect their appearance, so that they may appear to others to be fasting. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you may not appear to others to be fasting, except to your Father who is hidden. And your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you.”

Meditation: This gospel passage should be familiar to everyone as it is proclaimed on Ash Wednesday – the beginning of the Season of Lent. And yet we sometimes forget that what we learn about ourselves and our lifestyle during Lent should be carried out not just for the 40 days of Lent but throughout our lifetime. So why, then, did Jesus single out prayer, fasting, and almsgiving for his disciples? The Jewish people considered these three as the cardinal works of the religious life. These were seen as the key signs of a pious person, the three great pillars on which the good life was based. Jesus pointed to the heart of the matter. Why do you pray, fast, and give alms? To draw attention to yourself so that others may notice and think highly of you? Or to give glory to God? The Lord warns his disciples of self-seeking glory – the preoccupation with looking good and seeking praise from others. True piety is something more than feeling good or looking holy. True piety is loving devotion to God. It is an attitude of awe, reverence, worship and obedience. It is a gift and working of the Holy Spirit that enables us to devote our lives to God with a holy desire to please him in all things (ref. Isaiah 11:1-2).

Prayer: O God, strength of those who hope in you, graciously hear our pleas, and, since without you mortal frailty can do nothing, grant us always the help of your grace, that in following your commands we may please you by our resolve and our deeds. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: What is the reward which Jesus points out to his disciples by living a life of regular prayer, fasting and almsgiving (as opposed to just 40 days a year)? It is communion with God our Father. In him alone we find the fullness of life and happiness, truth and beauty, love and joy. Saint Augustine wrote the following prayer in his *Confessions*: "When I am completely united to you, there will be no more sorrows or trials; entirely full of you, my life will be complete. The Lord rewards those who seek him with humble and repentant hearts. He renews us each day and gives us new hearts of love and compassion that we may serve him and our neighbor with glad and generous hearts. Do you want to grow in your love for God and for your neighbor? Seek him expectantly in prayer, with fasting, and in generous giving to those in need."

Thursday, June 18 ~ Eleventh Week in the Season of Ordinary Time

Holy Gospel: Matthew 6:7-15 Jesus said to his disciples: "In praying, do not babble like the pagans, who think that they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them. Your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

"This is how you are to pray: 'Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.'

"If you forgive others their transgressions, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your transgressions."

Meditation: It is through the gift of the Holy Spirit that we can know God personally and call him "Abba, Father" (ref. Romans 8:15). We can approach God our Father with confidence and boldness because Jesus Christ has opened the way to heaven for us through his death and resurrection. When we ask God the Father for help, he fortunately does not give us what we deserve. Instead, he responds with grace and favor and mercy. It is his nature to love generously and to forgive mercifully. When he gives he gives more than we need so we will have something to share with others in their need as well. God the Father is kind and forgiving towards us and he expects us to treat our neighbor the same. Do you treat others as they deserve, or do you treat them as the Lord would treat you with his grace and favor and mercy? Jesus' prayer includes an injunction that we must ask God to forgive us in proportion as we forgive those who have wronged us. Ask the Lord to free your heart of any anger, bitterness, resentment, selfishness, indifference, or coldness towards others. Let the Holy Spirit fill you with the fire of his burning love and compassion and with the river of his overflowing mercy and kindness.

Prayer: O God, strength of those who hope in you, graciously hear our pleas, and, since without you mortal frailty can do nothing, grant us always the help of your grace, that in following your commands we may please you by our resolve and our deeds. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: When you pray, do you pray with joy and confidence? The Jewish people were noted for their devotion to prayer. Formal prayer was prescribed for three set times a day. And the rabbis had a prayer for every occasion. Jesus warns his disciples against formalism, making prayer something mechanical and devoid of meaning, with little thought for God. When Jesus taught his disciples to pray he gave them the disciple's prayer, what we call the *Our Father* or *Lord's Prayer*. This prayer of Jesus calls God "our Father" and boldly asks for the things we need to live as his sons and daughters.

Friday, June 19 ~ Eleventh Week in the Season of Ordinary Time

Optional Memorial: Saint Romuald, Abbott

Holy Gospel: Matthew 6:19-23 Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and decay destroy, and thieves break in and steal. But store up treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor decay destroys, nor thieves break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.

"The lamp of the body is the eye. If your eye is sound, your whole body will be filled with light; but if your eye is bad, your whole body will be in darkness. And if the light in you is darkness, how great will the darkness be."

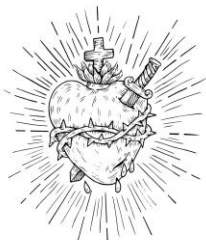
Meditation: Have you given any thought to the kind of treasure and wealth that you are searching for in your earthly life? Sometimes we are so focused on our careers and jobs that our spiritual life, our faith life, suffers. We must remember that Jesus offers a treasure of incomparable value and worth. But in order to recognize this we need healthy eyes – good spiritual vision. What Jesus said about seeking treasure made perfect sense to his audience: keep what lasts! Aren't we all trying to find something we treasure in the hope that it will bring us happiness, peace, and security? Jesus contrasts two very different kinds of wealth – material wealth and spiritual wealth. Jesus urges his disciples to get rich by investing in wealth and treasure which truly lasts, not just for a lifetime, but for all eternity as well. Jesus offers heavenly treasures which cannot lose their value by changing circumstances, such as diminishing currency, material degradation, loss, or physical destruction. The treasure which Jesus offers is kept safe and uncorrupted by God himself. What is this treasure which Jesus offers so freely and graciously? It is the treasure of God himself – the source and giver of every good gift and blessing in this life – and a kingdom that will endure forever. The treasure of God's kingdom produces unspeakable joy because it unites us with the source of all joy and blessings – God himself. God offers us the treasure of unending joy and friendship with himself and with all who are united with him in his heavenly kingdom.

Prayer: O God, strength of those who hope in you, graciously hear our pleas, and, since without you mortal frailty can do nothing, grant us always the help of your grace, that in following your commands we may please you by our resolve and our deeds. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Contemplation: Our vision can be easily blinded or distorted as to what is true, good, lovely, pure, and eternal (ref. Philippians 4:8). Certainly prejudice, jealousy, and self-conceit can distort our judgment of ourselves and others and lead to moral blindness. Prejudice and self-conceit also destroy good judgment and blinds us to the facts and to their significance for us. Jealousy and envy make us despise others and mistrust them as enemies rather than friends. We need to fearlessly examine ourselves to see if we are living according to right judgment and sound principles or if we might be misguided by blind prejudice or some other conceit. Love is not jealous ...but rejoices with the truth (ref. 1 Corinthians 13:4-6). Do you live your life in the light of God's truth? If so, where do you direct your time and energy most often?

Special Meditation – Month of June: Dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus ***The Eucharistic Presence of the Sacred Heart***

In the Holy Eucharist the incarnate Son of God is present whole and entire — soul and body, divinity and humanity. In every consecrated Host, therefore, His Sacred Heart is present, an integral part of His glorified body, that living organ which for all the years of His mortal life pulsed His precious blood through artery and vein, and faithfully responded to every joy and every sorrow of His soul in both its Christ-life and its Jesus-life. After the consecration at every Holy Mass, in every Host received in Holy Communion, and in every tabernacle wherein the Blessed Sacrament is actually housed, there is present the Heart which is the most magnificent *sanctum* of the Holy Trinity and the universal instrument for the realization of all the Savior designs of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; there is present the Heart by whose wisdom, mercy, and love those Savior designs were so gloriously executed; there is the Heart which is the living source and symbol of His whole life and work, both as the Christ of God and as the Jesus of the world, and therefore the source and symbol of the floods of light and streams of energy poured out to souls after that fatal hour in Paradise; yes, there is present on the altar the Heart which accounts even for this Eucharistic Presence itself, since it was from the love fountains of this Heart that came His desire to eat that Pasch with His beloved Apostles on Holy Thursday night and to speak those mysteriously sweet and mighty words: "Do this in commemoration of Me!" — from *Our Way to the Father* by Fr. Leo M. Krenz, S.J.

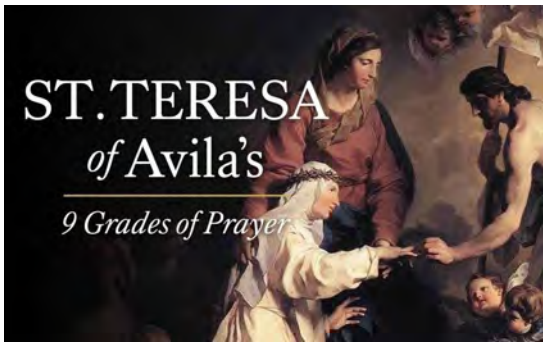

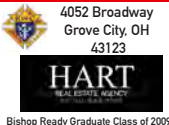
